3(a)	જય હો (જય વસાવડા) Students may refer to all or some of the following points in their answers.
	The title 'Jai Ho' means victory in Gujarati and this is very relevant to young people today, due to the immense pressure placed on them in moder- day life.
	 This book is a compilation of motivational essays aimed at young people who are either very frustrated or depressed and see no future for themselves. They feel the need to perform well academically. If they fail their exams or become unemployed, (or even if a relationship ends) they can end their life to avoid the stigma of being a 'loser or failure'. As a result, some people choose the wrong path in life, which leads them into trouble, notably crime.
	 The author addresses the issues that young people face by outlining the techniques to deal with social pressure. He gives examples of his own life and how he managed to succeed, proving everyone wrong - despite being written off by society as a failure.
	 The author calls on the youth of today to 'roar like a lion' and conquer any adversities that may come their way; with the help of qualities such as perseverance, hard work and patience. He also calls on the youth to increase their skill set and remember human values such as compassion. He uses examples of famous people who were rejected by society but who were never deterred and have left a lasting impression on others.

3(b)	જય હો (જય વસાવડા) Students may refer to all or some of the following points in their answers.
	 Jay Vasavda is a well-travelled young Gujarati writer who brings his own fresh perspective to this book. His style of writing is unique and he has been very successful in attracting a large following of readers.
	 He has used simple Gujarati language, which is easy to understand. He uses the colloquial language, referred to as 'Gujlish' language, used by today's youth in Gujarat, which is a combination of Gujarati and English. Helping his readers to relate to his work easily has been key in attracting a wider audience.
	 He draws from a range of topics and examples from the world of sport, cinema, politics and literature to persuade his readers to believe in themselves. For example, a poem by US poet Maya Angelou 'You may write me down in history' or a quote from US President Roosevelt. The lyrics of artist Mariah Carey's song 'Hero' are also written about. At the end of every chapter he cites inspirational quotes, calling them 'power punches' in the face of adversity.
	 The writer's storytelling and narrative style is very engaging. For example, he narrates the story of the Hollywood film '300', which is based on Spartan warriors who never gave up and died to save their homeland. The reader can visualise the entire war scene through this portrayal. It inspires readers to be brave hearted, just as the Spartans were.
